

WHAT IS FOSTER CARE?

Foster Care is a protective service provided to children in custody of the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS). It provides substitute, temporary care for a period of time when a child must be separated from his or her own parents or relatives. Foster parents play a special role in the life of a child who, because of abuse, neglect, or sexual victimization, needs a safe place to live on a temporary basis.

WHY SHOULD I BECOME A FOSTER PARENT?

With 421 children in foster care in the Baton Rouge Region, we have children of all ages who desperately need a safe and loving home to live in and a foster family who will encourage and support them while they walk through a very traumatic season! This is your opportunity as the Body of Christ to meet an immediate need right here in your community that will impact a child for a lifetime!

WHAT DOES "FASTTRACK" MEAN?

With a critical shortage of foster homes, local churches are partnering with DCFS to meet a serious need in EBR Parish to certify at least 40 new foster families by Christmas. Fast-Track means that both church partners and DCFS staff will focus on getting families through the certification process as quickly and smoothly as possible and supporting families once children are placed in their homes.

What are some of the requirements to becoming certified as a foster parent that I should know about?

While all foster parent certification requirements will be discussed at the Orientation Meeting, it is important to know that in addition to attending the 24 hours of in-person pre-service training and completing 6 hours of homework, you must be at least 21 years of age, have adequate space in your home for an additional child, participate in a home study process, be financially stable (able to meet your own family's needs), complete 6 hours of online training, complete medical exams on each household member, obtain references, and complete fingerprinting clearances and pass state registry and federal criminal clearances for all household members over the age of 18.
